Curricular area	Suggested activities	Online links or SeeSaw task
Literacy – Reading 	<ul style="list-style-type: none">Choose a story from home or scan one from the book list & read it with a family member.Chat about the key features of a story – author, illustrator, blurb & a character	
Literacy – Spelling 	<ul style="list-style-type: none">Practise writing the months of year. Have a go at writing in an interesting way e.g. rainbow writing, playdough/magnetic letters or bubble writing.Design a wordsearch on a topic of your choice e.g. animals Use a dictionary/computer to check your spelling. Give someone the wordsearch to complete! Try https://thewordsearch.com/maker/	
Literacy – Writing 	<ul style="list-style-type: none">Help an adult write a list for the shopping.Choose 1 of your favourite books and design a new front cover for it. Remember to include the tittle, author & a picture.	
Numeracy & Maths 	<ul style="list-style-type: none">Go on a shape hunt in your house / garden. Can you write a list or draw a picture of what you found?Design a number diary. Fold a sheet of paper and give your diary a front cover with a title e.g. 'Super Numbers'. Choose a different number for each page & write about where you've seen the number e.g. it's my house number, on the TV. You may even want to cut & stick examples from magazines/catalogues or draw pictures.	
Health & Wellbeing 	<ul style="list-style-type: none">Draw someone in your life as a superhero. Design a costume for them and describe their superpower.Have a go at making a fruit salad. Can you draw a picture of what you did or upload a photo to your Seesaw?	
Other areas: IDL/STEM 	<ul style="list-style-type: none">STEM creativity challenge! What can you do with a cereal box?Design a poster to encourage people to pick up litter. Use books/internet for ideas. Make sure your poster has a title & an interesting picture.
